Cockfield's Farm Park



Team Karting




Magna Science Adventure Centre






Butterfly Garden

Our students have had the incredible opportunity to witness the miracle of metamorphosis right here in school! Using a special educational kit, we were able to observe the fascinating life cycle of the Painted Lady Butterfly — from tiny caterpillars to chrysalides, and finally, to beautiful adult butterflies. The caterpillars arrived in a clear cup with all the food they needed, and over the course of a few weeks, we watched them grow, spin silk, and transform. Once they became chrysalides, they were carefully moved into a butterfly habitat where, after a few more days, they emerged as butterflies ready to be released into the wild. It was a truly magical and educational experience for everyone involved, bringing science to life in the most hands-on way!
